BEEKEEPING LONG COURSE FOR BEGINNERS 2017

A two-term course will be held in 2017 on Monday evenings, at the new Hives and Honey Show avilion at the Great Yorkshire Showground in Harrogate, and at Association apiaries around Harrogate District. It will include both theoretical lectures, hive building tuition and practical bee handling. The course is designed for complete beginners, or beekeepers with some limited experience seeking to improve their knowledge. This course, taught by experienced members of the Association, has run annually for over 25 years, and is widely acknowledged to be one of the best and most comprehensive courses available.

Successful completion of this Course should prove all the information needed beginners to gain the Nationally recognised Basic Assessment of the British Beekeepers Association in 2018.

Term 1 - starting Mon 23rd January 2017 (12 lectures plus 1 practical hive building session.)

The lectures in this term will cover all that you need to know to start to keep bees safely and well, including the natural history of honeybees, beekeeping equipment, honey and beeswax processing, the treatment of bee pests, and diseases, swarm control, selection of apiary sites, the year's work, record keeping, forage etc. etc. There is also a practical session covering the assembly of beehive components from the generally supplied flat pack form.

Term 2 - starting 15th May 2017 (8 sessions) (NB this start date may be subject to revision)

This term will provide tuition in the practical bee handling skills to start keeping bees safely and in good health. You will learn how to inspect and care for bees under the supervision of an experienced and knowledgeable beekeeper, using colonies of bees belonging to the Association. The Association and its members will endeavour to supply each student with a small colony of bees to work with, but this supply cannot be guaranteed. At the end of this term, subject to supply, when the colony has increased in size, you will have the opportunity to buy the colony of bees, to transfer them to your own hive and to take home.

Review of Course and Q&A session 4th September 2017 (1 session)

This is an opportunity to have any outstanding questions answered by the Course Tutors.

The fee for the complete course is £240.00

To ensure that all the required insurance for your beekeeping activities on the Course is in place it is a requirement that you become a member of the Association, and the Course fee includes a full membership fee for the year commencing 1 September 2016. In addition to the full benefits of membership, including benefits provided through the Association's membership of the British Beekeepers Association, this fee includes all teaching and course educational materials. Course members have the option to purchase a complete National beehive and some associated equipment from Claro Bees Ltd (the Association's trading arm) at a reduced price.

6 Standard Procedures for the Retention and Disclosure of HRBKA Data

6a Retention of Data

The HRBKA database will record the names, postal addresses, telephone numbers, email addresses and subscription payment details of all members. Where applicable the British Beekeepers Association (BBKA) examination results and / or level of BBKA qualification will also be recorded.

From time to time other information may be recorded usually as paper records for brief periods and only for the immediate purpose at hand. This includes Show results, willingness to assist at Shows, skills that may be of value to the Association, and with Association demonstrations etc.

As part of the Spray Liaison Scheme the location of members apiaries may be recorded.

6b Disclosure of Data to Third Parties

HRBKA will disclose to the BBKA names, addresses and membership classification of all members. This is for the specific purposes of mailing BBKA News.

Names and addresses of members, *including email addresses and telephone numbers*, will be disclosed to The Regional Bee Disease Inspector at least annually for the specific purpose of improving disease control.

Names and addresses may need to be disclosed to Bee Diseases Insurance Ltd for the purpose of protection of members. The location of apiary sites belonging to members together with the member's name and telephone number will be circulated at least annually to appropriate spray contractors, farmers, and growers for the specific purpose of prevention of loss of colonies.

Subscription and other payment (for example, expenses) records will be retained by the Association Treasurer for a period of six years, and then shredded and/or deleted. The treasurer may make further disclosure to the auditor for the specific purpose of validation of the accounts. Names and addresses of members, including email addresses and telephone numbers, will be disclosed to the Association's Direct Debit administration company for the purpose of collecting subscriptions. In the interests of controlling bee diseases as effectively as possible the Association Committee strongly recommends that the relevant information is disclosed to the Bee Inspector.

6c Disclosure of Data to Association members

The names, postal addresses, telephone numbers and email addresses of Officers of the Association, committee members and holders of posts of Special Responsibility will be published in each edition of The Apiarist. The latter is circulated to all members. The Apiarist has further restricted circulation to the editors of similar BKA publications.

An Association Handbook & Directory will be published annually. This contains the information referred to above and in addition the names, postal addresses, telephone numbers and, if space is available, email addresses of all members. This booklet's circulated to all members.

Officers of the Association and committee members will have available the email address of other Officers and committee members for the specific purpose of circulation of information relevant to committee meetings and management of the Association.

The Officers and committee members may use members email addresses for the circulation of information directly relevant to their class of membership (for example notice of upcoming meetings and last minute changes to such meetings) and interests (for example membership of a show or education group) and any urgent matters (for example detection of bee disease in the Association area). The email addresses of all members are on a Google Group for use by the Committee only.
